We are focusing on the importance of school uniform.

A **school uniform** teaches students to **dress** smartly and take pride in their appearance. Perhaps most importantly, a **uniform** means pupils don't have to worry about peer pressure when it comes to their clothes. When everyone is dressed the same, worrying about what you look like isn't so **important**. It's really important that all children stick to the uniform guidelines published on the school website [www.scsj.rbkc.sch.uk/parents/uniform.php](http://www.scsj.rbkc.sch.uk/parents/uniform.php)

Here are some of the points we have been raising with the children:

**Jewellery** - There should be no jewellery apart from tiny plain hoop or stud earrings.

**Shoes** - Must be black (no trainers or sandals). We appreciate that some children are wearing trainers at the moment so we will aim for black shoes to be worn from September.

**Hair** - Shoulder length hair should be tied back so children don't catch head lice.

Hair bands and bobbles should be plain green, green check or black (no fancy bows, flowers, cats or unicorns).

There should be no patterns shaved into hair (no stars, lines or zigzags).
