Reminder

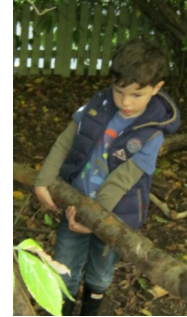
School lunch fees are now £12.50 per week and **must** be paid in advance.
